Opening Kick...

- The Dolphins wrap up their home schedule against Butler, honoring the 14 seniors playing the final home game of their careers.
- The Dolphins need one win in their final two games for the third winning season in program history and first back-to-back winning campaigns ever at JU.
- Junior running back **Rudell Small** produced his third straight 100-yard outing with 151 yards on 16 carries against Valparaiso. The outing increased his school-record setting career total to 2,781 yards and was the 12th 100-yard day of his career.
- Sophomore wide receiver **Josh Philpart** extended his streak of consecutive games with a catch to 17 as he had two receptions for 22 yards, with his 11th touchdown of the season, adding to his school record for a single season. He enters today's game needing 15 catches and 75 yards to set the single-season record in both categories.
- Sophomore quarterback **Josh McGregor** threw three touchdowns to increase his season total to 26, breaking his own school record set last season. He needs 130 yards to break his passing yards total of last year and needs 111 yards to break the school's all-time yardage record.
- The JU defense has made a living on pressuring the quarterback this season - leading the country in sacks per game with an average of 3.67.

Finally!

It seemed like the JU football team was never going to force a turnover this season. That disappeared in the first quarter against Morehead State when senior free safety **Jason Wood** picked off a pass and returned it 52 yards for a touchdown. The Dolphins were the last team in the country to record a turnover this season.

Milestone Win

While the JU win at San Diego was the first in program history, it also allowed the Dolphins to reach another milestone as it was the 50th win in the program's history. It took 12 seasons for JU to reach the 50-win milestone and it happened in the program's 118th game.

Loving the Fall

It seems that when the temperatures get cooler, the Dolphins raise the level of their game. Over the last two seasons, JU is sporting a 11-2 record in the months of October and November.

Flag on the Play

The Dolphins have developed a propensity to draw the yellow hankies out of the referees pockets this season - ranking 112 out of 118 teams in the Football Championship Subdivision in penalty yards per game. JU has been penalized an for an average of 83.2 yards per game on an average of eight penalties per game. Jacksonville leads the PFL in penalty yards, giving its opponents 749 yards.

Balanced Offensive Attack Leads to Rout of Valpo

Rudell Small's 57-yard touchdown run on the second play from scrimmage set the tone for the Dolphins offense as they piled up 581 yards of total offense. Here are some notes from the contest:

- JU's 581 yards of total offense is the third-highest single-game output in school history and the second-highest in the Kerwin Bell era.
- **Josh Philpart** caught two passes for 22 yards, the first being an 11-yard touchdown strike - his school-record 11th of the season. It also was the 15th of his career, tying **Geavon Tribble** atop the all-time list.
- **Rudell Small** rushed for 151 yards on 16 carries for his third straight 100-yard outing. It is the 12th 100-yard rushing day of his career.

- **Josh McGregor** had his second straight 300-yard aerial game with 305 yards. It is his sixth 300-yard outing of his career and the fourth of the 2009 campaign.
- **Shaun Lewis** had two sacks, increasing his season total to eight - just two away from his total of last season. It also raised his career total to 20, just five away from tying the school's all-time record.

Drake Comeback Dooms PFL Title Hopes

Despite holding a 28-10 lead at one point in the game, the Dolphins were unable to handle prosperity - watching Drake scored 13 unanswered points in the fourth quarter as the Bulldogs stayed undefeated in PFL play with a 45-38 win at home. Here's some notes from the contest:

- The Dolphins lost for the fourth straight time in Des Moines and have allowed at least 40 points in every trip. It is the third time JU has seen a fourth quarter lead slip away this season.
- **Josh Philpart** caught two touchdown passes en route to this fourth 100-yard receiving performance of the season. He has at least one receiving touchdown in the last five games and at least two in the last three outings.
- **Josh McGregor** had his third 300-yard outing of the season and fifth of his career with 321 yards. He also set career highs in completions (27) and attempts (43).
- **Rudell Small** had another big game with 100 yards on 19 carries. It is his third 100-yard performance in the last four weeks.
- **Kennan Bowe** picked off two passes in the game, returning one 35 yards for a touchdown - the second defensive score of the season.
- Penalties haunted the Dolphins throughout the game as JU committed nine for 96 yards - with four being personal fouls.
- JU picked up just one sack in the game - the lowest total this season.
- For the first time this season, JU converted all of its extra point attempts.

Dolphins Get First Win at San Diego

After losing its first three trips to the West Coast, JU picked up its first win at San Diego with a dominating 34-16 decision over the preseason favorites. Here's a look at the records that fell during the game:

- **Josh Philpart** broke the school's single-season record for touchdown receptions with his seventh and eighth scores of the season.
- **Rudell Small** rushed for a season-best 151 yards on 18 carries, setting a new career-long rush with a 55-yard run. It is the third-best rushing performance of his stellar career.
- **Josh McGregor** threw for only 161 yards, but threw three touchdowns to raise his total for the season to 20. It is the fifth straight game in which he has thrown at least two touchdowns.

- **Jason Wood** picked up his second interception of the season and the fifth of his career.
- The Dolphins rushed for 240 yards against the Toreros, the highest single-game total since putting up 265 against Campbell last season.

Records Fall in JU rout of Morehead State

The Dolphins played their best four quarters of the season against Morehead State, winning the Homecoming game for the sixth straight season by recording the third shutout in program history and the second of the **Kerwin Bell** era. Here's a look at the records that fell during the game:

- **Rudell Small** became the school's all-time leader in rushing yards with 15 carries for 52 yards. He passed Jerry Brant's record 2,370 yards with his total of 2,379.
- **Josh McGregor** threw four touchdown passes to shatter the school record for career touchdown passes of 38 set by Mike Sturgill. McGregor finished the game with 41 touchdown passes, 10 of those coming in two games against Morehead State.
- The JU defense held Morehead State to 113 yards of total offense, the lowest total by an opponent in program history. The previous record was 160 yards against Butler in 2006.
- **Josh Philpart** caught two touchdown passes to move into a four-way tie for the most receiving touchdowns in a season with his sixth. **Geavon Tribble** was the last Dolphin to reach that mark in 2008.
- **Shaun Lewis** tied the school's single-game record for sacks with three, equaling the mark set by **Justin Yowell** in 1998 against Methodist.
- The win marked the fourth straight for JU and gives the Dolphins a 5-4 lead in the all-time series.

Philpart Catches PFL Top Offensive Honor, Gets 1,000 Career Yards

Sophomore wide receiver **Josh Philpart** had his third 100-yard receiving day against Morehead State, catching six passes for 191 yards and two touchdowns to earn PFL Offensive "Player of the Week" honors for the first time. With his big day, Philpart became the eighth Dolphin in program history to record 1,000 receiving yards in their career while tying the program record for most receiving touchdowns in a season with his fifth and sixth scores. Philpart's 191 yards receiving is the 15th highest single-game total this season and is his second-best effort of the year (195 vs. Webber, T13th for a single-game performance nationally).

"Heave on the Hudson" Dooms JU

The Dolphins couldn't stop another fourth quarter rally as Marist overcame a 27-17 deficit in the final 6:37 for a 31-27 win. It is the second time this season JU has seen a double-digit lead evaporate in the fourth quarter and the fourth time in the past two seasons.

- **Rudell Small** had his second straight 100-yard rushing game with 121 yards on 24 carries.
- **Elliott Finkley** had three catches for 74 yards, two of which were touchdowns. Finkley's 64-yard TD reception from **Josh McGregor** is the longest play for the Dolphins this season.
- A trio of Dolphins racked up double figures in tackles, led by **Jason Wood's** 13. **Shaun Lewis** had a career-best 11 while **Joseph Fennell** had 12. It is the fourth time this season that the younger Fennell has put up at least 10 tackles in a game.
- JU gave up a 100-yard receiver for the third straight game as Marist's James LaMacchia had 10 catches for 195 yards.
- **Josh McGregor** threw four touchdown passes in the game which is tied for the second-highest single-game total in program history.

Dolphins Open PFL Play With Win Over Davidson

After watching Davidson rally from 21 down a year ago, the Dolphins held off another late rally by the Wildcats to open Pioneer Football League play with a 27-21 win.

- **Rudell Small** had his first 100-yard rushing effort of the season, going for 110 yards on 18 carries with one touchdown, the 25th of his career. It is the eighth time he has rushed for 100 yards or more in a game during his career.
- The Dolphins allowed a 100-yard receiver for the second straight game.
- JU snapped a three-game losing streak to Davidson and evened the all-time series at six. It was JU's first win in the series since 2004.

McGregor's Scoring Gets Offensive Player of the Week Honor

Sophomore quarterback **Josh McGregor** was responsible for three of JU's four touchdowns in the 27-21 win over Davidson. McGregor threw for 261 yards, his seventh career outing with 250 yards or more passing, with two touchdowns to give him 33 career passing touchdowns. He also rushed for another, his third career rushing score. It is the second time that he has earned the PFL's top offensive weekly honor.

Old Dominion Rallies Late

The Dolphins had made a habit of turning late deficits into victories in the past year. Old Dominion turned the tables on JU, scoring 14 points in the final 10 minutes to upset JU in the home opener, 28-27, when Donovan Curry's 52-yard field goal attempt sailed wide to the right.

- The Dolphins lost their home opener for the first time in the **Kerwin Bell** era.
- Old Dominion generated 190 yards of total offense in the fourth quarter, driving the length of the field twice for touchdowns.
- **Josh McGregor** threw for 300 yards, his fourth career 300-yard outing and his sixth with more than 250 yards passing. His three passing touchdowns marked the sixth time he has thrown three touchdowns in a game.
- **Josh Philpart** recorded his second 100-yard receiving game of his career, making six catches for 109 yards.
- The loss was the third time in the last two seasons that JU saw a double-digit lead evaporate in the second half.
- The Dolphins racked up 446 yards of total offense, their second 400-yard performance of the season.

Dolphins Stymied at Samford

The Dolphins stepped up for the second straight year to face a Southern Conference team as they traveled to Samford - falling 27-0 to the Bulldogs. It is just the second time the Dolphins have been shutout in the **Kerwin Bell** era.

- The defense stepped up its game, racking up four sacks and eight tackles for a loss.
- **Logan Chipperfield** tied the school record for most punts in a game (11) and set a new record in punting yards (468).
- The Dolphins had 15 possessions in the game with none lasting longer than 2:37. JU had three drives that were less than a minute in duration. For the game, JU held the ball for 23:24, the second shortest time of possession in the Kerwin Bell era.
- **Daryl Campbell** led the defense with 11 tackles, with **Joseph Fennell** adding 10.
- The Dolphins' 101 yards of total offense is the lowest output in the Kerwin Bell era, surpassing the previous low of 184 at Dayton (Oct. 6, 2007).

Chipperfield gets Player of the Week

It's not often you think of punters as a weapon. But JU's **Logan Chipperfield** was a weapon at Samford, punting for a school-record 468 yards – an average of 42.5 yards on 11 punts, to earn Pioneer Football League "Special Teams Player of the Week" honors on Sept. 13.

The Jacksonville Beach native flipped field position several times against Samford, booting two punts for more than 50 yards, with two downed inside the 20-yard line.

With his stellar night, the Dolphins moved into 11th place nationally in net punting – averaging 40.35 yards per punt after the return, which leads the PFL. Chipperfield enters this weekend ranked 12th nationally in punting average at 42.82 yards per punt.

National Career Leadership at JU

With the record setting performances the last few seasons, there are several Dolphins that rank in the top 20 among active players nationally in a few categories.

Most noteworthy is **Rudell Small's** rankings in rushing yards and rushing touchdowns. His 2,781 career rushing yards is 13th nationally and his 28 rushing touchdowns is tied for 13th. He is fifth among juniors in rushing yards and is third for the lead among juniors in touchdowns.

Josh McGregor cracked the top 20 among active passers in passing yards per game, averaging 208.9, which ranks 14th among active QBs. He is the only sophomore signal caller on the list.

Dolphins set to be Road Warriors in 2009

While the 2009 schedule doesn't feature a defending national champion, it's difficulty is measured in the number of games on the road - and the length of those trips.

Being based in Jacksonville, the Dolphins will visit the Northeast (at Marist), the Southeast (at Samford), the Midwest (at Drake) and the West Coast (at San Diego). Along with that, JU will make a trip to North Carolina (at Campbell) to wrap up the regular season.

All told, the Dolphins will travel 5,693 miles this season.

Preseason All-America Selections

The Dolphins have two players that have caught people's eyes nationally to earn preseason All-America mentions.

Senior defensive back **Jason Wood**, coming off his best season as a Dolphin, was named preseason All-America by Consensus Draft Services. Joining him with the prestigious preseason honor was junior punt returner **Elliott Finkley**, who returned three punts for touchdowns last season - setting a new school record.

Winning Season = Big Improvement

With the win over Valparaiso last year, the Dolphins won their seventh game of the season - clinching the second winning season in the history of the program.

JU's seven-game winning streak was the longest in the 11-year history of the program, passing the four-game winning streak that opened the 2001 season.

The championship season has come against the 12th hardest schedule in the country - ahead of FCS powers Georgia Southern, McNeese State, Maine and Youngstown State.

The Dolphins improved by six wins over last season, the largest turnaround in the country.

One Hit Wonders? Dolphins Picked to Finish Second

Despite winning the title and returning 16 starters this season, JU was picked to finish in a tie for second with Dayton in the annual preseason coaches' poll.

For the fourth straight year, San Diego was picked to win the league by receiving five of the 10 first place votes. Dayton received three first place votes while the Dolphins got two.

"I don't put much stock into preseason polls, but it shows that we still have work to do," said JU head coach Kerwin Bell. "The league race is going to be tight again as anyone can step up and win the league."

Morehead State was picked fourth, followed in order by Butler, Drake, Davidson, Marist, Valparaiso and Campbell.

National Votes Coming In

A PFL championship turned heads across the country about the JU football program as the Dolphins earned votes in the two major preseason polls for the first time in program history. JU has received votes in The Sports Network poll in every week but one this season.

Dolphins Prone to Late Comebacks

JU has seen its fair share of last minute heroics in the past two years, watching four games slip away after building double-digit leads. Here's a look at the heartbreaking games for the Dolphins in the past two years:

Oct. 10, 2009 Marist 31, JU 27

Leading 27-17 with 6:37 left in the game, Marist completes a 26-yard touchdown pass with seven seconds left to cap the comeback.

Sept. 19, 2009 Old Dominion 28, JU 27

Leading 27-14, Old Dominion marched the length of the field twice - ending the comeback with a 10-play, 91-yard drive that took up just 1:23, as a blocked extra point doomed the Dolphins.

Sept. 27, 2008 Davidson 38, JU 35

The Dolphins were cruising, up 35-14 with two minutes to go in the third quarter. The Wildcats rallied with the games final 24 points, the last coming on a field goal with just over 40 seconds left.

Sept. 20, 2008 UNC-Pembroke 22, JU 21

Sporting a 21-3 lead with four minutes left in the third quarter, UNCP scored the final 19 points of the game. A 25-yard field goal after a JU turnover proved to be the winning points in the contest.

Last Minute Wins

It's been a while since JU has put together a last minute win like the one against San Diego last year. **Donovan Curry's** 50-yard field goal was the first time in the history of the program that Jacksonville has won a game on a field goal in the final two minutes.

In the 11 years of JU football, the Dolphins have won on a score late in the fourth quarter seven times. The last time JU won on a score inside the final two minutes of regulation was against on a fumble recovery for a touchdown with 1:25 left against Dayton in 2006.

Here's a look at the other last-minute heroics in JU history:

Sept. 1, 2001 JU 20, Lenoir-Rhyne 16

Trialing 16-13, Jon Turner catches a 62-yard touchdown pass from Gary Cooper with 9:27 left in the game. The Dolphins get a stop and run out the clock with a 23-play drive.

Sept. 13, 2003 JU 42, Wingate 38

Rallying from 21 points down, Emmett Hunter scored on a 7-yard run with 1:11 left to cap a 10-play, 55-yard drive for the win.

Sept. 20, 2003 JU 14, Coastal Carolina 9

Mike Sturgill leads JU on a 16-play, 77-yard drive that is capped when Sturgill hits Justin Knowles on a 14-yard touchdown with 6:29 left in the game.

Sept. 27, 2003 JU 34, Valparaiso 27

The cardiac Dolphins win late again as Mike Sturgill hooks up with Eldin Ferguson on a 10-yard touchdown pass with 2:24 left in the game.

Oct. 9, 2004 JU 29, Davidson 26

Mike Sturgill used some more of his fourth quarter magic, finding Eldin Ferguson on a 15-yard touchdown pass with 31 seconds left to lift JU to a crucial PFL win.

Oct. 22, 2005 JU 33, Austin Peay 26

Steven Battle's 1-yard touchdown run with 1:25 left in the game capped a 12-play, 77-yard drive to give JU the win on the road.

Oct. 14, 2006 JU 28, Dayton 21

The Dolphins beat Dayton for the first time in program history when Mirco Zanella recovered a Rob Florian fumble and returned it seven yards for the game-winning touchdown.

Oct. 25, 2008 JU 30, San Diego 29

Donovan Curry's 50-yard field goal with 1:23 left in the game capped a 10-point rally in the final four minutes to give the Dolphins their first win over the three-time defending PFL champions.

Nov. 22, 2008 JU 19, Dayton 14

Trailing 14-0 entering the fourth quarter, Geavon Tribble's 7-yard run on a reverse with 5:00 left in the game capped an epic rally to give JU its first PFL championship.

LAKE WALES, Fla. - Wind, rain, nor lightning could stop the JU football team in its season opener as the Dolphins survived for a 40-24 win Saturday night at Legion Field against Webber International.

The Dolphins (1-0) put up 448 yards of total offense with Josh Philpart making six catches for a career-best 195 yards and two touchdowns. Josh McGregor threw for 315 yards and four touchdowns, completing 11-of-22 passes.

The game was delayed for two hours and 35 minutes due to lightning and a torrential down pour at the end of the first quarter with JU sporting a 7-0 lead.

"We hung in there tonight and was able to come away with the win," said JU head coach Kerwin Bell. "This is a new team and they showed a championship mentality late with the game in the balance."

Philpart's 195 yards receiving is the fifth highest total in school history and is the most by a Dolphin since Geavon Tribble's 109 yards at Morehead State last season.

Rudell Small rushed for 103 yards and two touchdowns to lead the JU rushing attack that piled up 133 yards.

JU's defense did its part as well despite being on the field for 38:55. Webber had 390 yards of total offense, limiting the Warriors to just 53 yards on the ground.

"The defense really stepped up and made some stops when we needed them," Bell said. "There were out there a long time tonight and we've got to do a better job of staying on the field on offense."

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. - The JU football team had its moments as they stepped up against a Southern Conference opponent for the second straight season, but fell to Samford at Seibert Stadium, 27-0.

The Dolphins defense showed signs of promise, holding the Bulldogs to just 146 yards on the ground, picking up four sacks and eight tackles for a loss.

Samford got 225 yards passing with two touchdowns from Dustin Taliaferro, while getting 73 yards on 13 carries with one touchdown on the ground from Chris Evans.

"We played a very good team tonight and we learned a lot about our team," said JU head coach Kerwin Bell. "We did this last year at Appalachian State, we tested ourselves against one of the top teams in the country - which is our goal in building program."

The Bulldogs led 3-0 at the end of the first quarter, but scored 17 points in the second quarter - capping the half with a 7-yard touchdown pass from Taliaferro to Jonathan Lowery to take a 20-0 lead into the locker room at the intermission.

Taliaferro hooked up with Riley Hawkins on a 51-yard score early in the second quarter with a Cameron Yaw field goal sandwiched in between.

JU's offense struggled to get going throughout the night, getting just 101 yards - with 68 of those coming in the air. Josh McGregor completed 8-of-21 for 62 yards, while Rudell Small led the rushing attack with 53 yards on 16 carries.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. - Thomas DeMarco's 32 yard touchdown pass to Dorian Jackson with 45 seconds left completed a furious fourth quarter comeback to finish the upset for Old Dominion, 28-27, over Jacksonville at D.B. Milne Field.

Jacksonville (1-2) saw its hopes to pull out the win after watching a 27-14 lead slip away in the final 10 minutes sail wide to the right on Donovan Curry's 52-yard field goal try as time expired.

Ultimately, the Dolphins worst enemy was themselves. JU turned the ball over four times and committed nine penalties for 123 yards that resulted in four Old Dominion (3-0) first downs.

"We made too many mistakes and you can't do that against a team like this," said JU head coach Kerwin Bell. "When you turn the ball over four times, things like this are going to happen."

The Dolphins had taken a 27-14 lead with 13:01 left in the game on Erik Stepelton's 11-yard touchdown pass to Larry Thompson.

The Monarchs didn't go quietly. After struggling against the JU defense for most of the game, Old Dominion piled up 196 yards against a banged up defense in the fourth quarter – starting the rally with a 47 yard run by DeMarco.

The run was later capped by the game-winning pass by DeMarco, who threw for 175 yards and one touchdown while rushing for 136 yards and one touchdown.

Sporting a 27-7 lead entering the fourth quarter, the Wildcats got two scores to cut the deficit to six and Mark Hanabury's last ditch reception came up a yard short of a first down with just over a minute to go as Joseph Fennell got the last of his six tackles to seal the win for JU.

Rudell Small rushed for a season-high 110 yards with one touchdown, while Josh McGregor threw for 261 yards and two scores to lead JU (2-2, 1-0 PFL) to its first win over Davidson since 2005.

Haywood Range led the JU defense with seven tackles, including two for a loss, as the dolphins racked up four sacks and 10 tackles for a loss.

"We're still a young football team that has a lot to learn," said JU head coach Kerwin Bell. "You've got to give Davidson a lot of credit for coming back when we had them down 27-7. We had chances to extend the lead and we have to learn to have that killer instinct to be a championship team."

JU had built a 20-point lead with a steady offensive effort and strong defensive play. JU was moving the ball at will - rolling up 376 yards in the first three quarters while holding the Wildcats to just 143 yards.

The Wildcats then turned the tables in the fourth quarter - piling up 139 yards in the final stanza, with 66 of that coming in the air from Matt Heavner, who came on in relief of starter Matt Blanchard.

The Dolphins opened the game by scoring on the third play from scrimmage as McGregor hooked up with Philpart on a 29-yard score just 1:25 into the game.

On Morehead's second drive, Wood read Zach Lewis' eyes and stepped in front of the pass to race in for the 52-yard score.

Sporting a 14-0 lead, the Dolphins wrapped up the first quarter when McGregor threw his 39th career touchdown pass - a 17-yard toss to Chris Kuck with 58 seconds left.

DES MOINES, Iowa - In an old fashioned shootout, the JU football team ran out of bullets in seeing a 38-32 lead vanish as Drake rallied with two fourth quarter touchdowns to pull out a 45-38 win in Pioneer Football League play.

The Bulldogs (7-1, 5-0 PFL) took their first lead of the game on Stephen Platek's 2-yard run with 9:04 left in the game as Drake came all the way back from being down 28-10 at one point in the first half.

JU (4-4, 3-2 PFL) can see its undoing came on penalties and turnovers. The Dolphins committed 10 penalties for 96 yards and lost three fumbles, which Drake turned into 14 points.

Jacksonville had two final drives, getting inside the 1-yard line on the first one, but was unable to tie the game.

"You've got to give Drake credit, they took advantage of our mistakes and you can't do that against a team like this," said JU head coach Kerwin Bell. "We had several chances to put this game away and we let them off the hook."

The fourth quarter, which has been a problem for the Dolphins all season, came back to haunt them again today.

Trailing 38-32, Drake drove 60 yards on seven plays despite losing starting quarterback Mike Piatkowski with his backup Peter Badovinac scoring on a 1-yard keeper to tie the game with 11:21 left in regulation.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. - Rudell Small's 57-yard touchdown run on the opening possession of the game set the tone for the JU offense as the Dolphins rolled up 581 yards in a 49-20 rout of Valparaiso in Pioneer Football League play.

JU's offensive output was led by Small's 151 yards on the ground with Josh McGregor throwing for 305 yards. The JU defense did its part as well, picking off two passes and holding the Crusaders to just 62 yards on the ground.

"This was a good win after last week's game," said JU head coach Kerwin Bell. "We set the tone early on offense and stayed in a good flow throughout the game. Anytime you don't use your punter, you must be doing something right."

Small's 57-yard run is the longest of his career, surpassing his previous best of 54 set at San Diego. It is the third straight 100-yard rushing day for the junior and the fifth of the season. As a team, JU piled up 266 yards on the ground, with Keith Dawson getting 74 yards on 10 carries and J.J. Laster getting 31 yards on seven carries.

McGregor was the maestro directing the offense, completing 16-of-24 passes with three touchdowns – connecting with 10 different receivers. Larry Thompson led the Dolphins with three catches for 63 yards.

JU scored on its first two possessions in the first four minutes of the game. Small busted his 57-yard scoring run on the second play from scrimmage, which was followed by McGregor hooking up with Josh Philpart on a 12-yard touchdown pass.

The reception was Philpart's 15 touchdown catch of his career, tying the school record set by Geavon Tribble last season.
