- 98 Players have signed professional contracts and former *MLB pitching Coach Rick Peterson* pitched at JU from 1975-1976.
- Former *2006 Atlantic Sun "Player of the Year" Daniel Murphy* was called up to the *Mets* in 2008 and hit .313 in a 131 at bats in his first stint in the major leagues.
- JU has won seven Conference Championships, has had six Conference Players of the Year, 32 All- American selections and 89 All- Conference selections
- In 2011, *Adam Brett Walker* was named *Atlantic Sun "Player of the Year."* In 2007, *Pete Clifford* was named *Atlantic Sun "Player of the Year."*
- In 2011, *Adam Brett Walker* was named a *semi-finalist* for the *Golden Spikes Award* and the *Dick Howser Award*.
- In 2011, *Adam Brett Walker* was named *2nd Team All American by Baseball America, 1st team by Perfect Game, 2nd Team by NCBWA, and 2nd Team by Louisville Slugger.*
- In 2011 *Taylor Ratliff* and *Chris Anderson* were both named *Freshman All Americans*. In 2010. *Adam Walker* and *Dan Gulbransen* were both named to Collegiate *Baseball Freshman All American Team*.
- Alexander has been named Conference Coach of the Year on 3 occasions and was selected as an assistant coach for the USA National Team in 2002.
- JU's Associate Head Coach Tim Montez has coached in eight NCAA Regional, one Super Regional, and has won a WCC, SEC, and *three A- Sun Conference Championships*.
- Montez has had 40 pitchers sign professional baseball contacts, including *two 1st round draft picks* and has had 13 nationally ranked recruiting classes in 16 years as a Recruiting Coordinator.
- Montez has coached or recruited a number of *Major League Players*; such as *Michael Young* of the Texas Rangers, CY Young award winner *Cliff Lee* of the Philadelphia Phillies, *Russ Ortiz* of the Houston Astros, *Barry Zito* of the San Francisco Giants, *Doug Fister* of the Seattle Mariners, and *Matt Garza* of the Chicago Cubs.
- Assistant coach Tommy Murphy, a third round draft pick of the Los Angeles Angels in 2000, played 10 years of professional baseball, made his *Major League debut on May 4, 2006* and was on the *LA Angels opening Day roster in 2007*.

- Brian Snyder completed his first full season as a coach with the team in 2011. Snyder was a *Baseball America 1st Team All-American* and a *1st round selection by the Oakland Athletics in 2003*
