**Brief Preview**

The JU women's basketball team ends a short home stand against Florida Gulf Coast on Saturday at 1 p.m.

Last time out, the Dolphins (7-16, 5-7 A-Sun) had its six-game home winning streak snapped by Stetson, 73-63, on Thursday in Swisher Gymnasium.

The Eagles (20-2, 12-0) continued to roll in A-Sun play with an 72-61 win against North Florida on Thursday. Courtney Chihil scored 16 points for the Eagles, while Brittney Kennedy tallied nine boards.

The Eagles have three players averaging double-digits in scoring, led by Sarah Hansen with a 13.0 clip. Nicoya Jackson is second with a 11.5 average, while Kelsey Jacobson has 10.7 points a contest.

In the first meeting, FGCU secured its eighth straight win in the series with a 74-51 decision on Jan. 9 in Fort Myers, Fla. Elgah Griffin scored 17 points off the bench to pace the Eagles. The Dolphins' lone win came in the first meeting in the series on Jan. 5, 2008, 62-58, at the Veterans Memorial Arena.

**GAME NOTABLES**

- JU has an eight-game losing streak to FGCU, the longest against any A-Sun opponent.
- JU is first in the A-Sun in steals (262), while ranking third in three-point field goal percentage defense (.291).
- \*Senior Crystals Bell has had three or more steals in 11 of the last 13 games, including seven vs Lipscomb (1/2) to tie a JU single-season record. She needs three steals to tie for fifth all-time. Bell is 10 shy of the JU single-season record.
- \* Junior Tracie Sneed needs only 13 more free throws to crack the top five in a single-season.
- JU is 1-11 when an opponent goes to the free-throw line more than the Dolphins.
- JU is 7-4 since Dec. 29 when they have recorded 10 or more steals. They were 0-5 before the holiday break.

## Dolphin Notables

Against Stetson, the Dolphins were held to five points in the final 10 minutes to take their fourth straight loss...the Hatters held a 21 to 12 advantage in points off of turnovers and tallied 46 points in the paint...JU hit eight three-pointers for the second straight contest and went 7 of 10 at the free-throw line...sophomore **Jade Cargill** led JU with 15 points and 11 boards...senior **Crystal Bell** tallied 14 points, nine boards and four of JU's 11 steals...junior **Tracie Sneed** scored 10 points and had four boards in the loss...at Belmont, Haley Nelson had 22 points and tallied 14 boards in helping the Bruins hold off a late JU run...the Dolphins went on a 15-4 run in the final four minutes to cut the deficit to three with eight seconds left...JU won the rebounding battle, 47-38...they also hit 8 of 15 three-pointers (53.3) and had 25 second-change points...Bell scored 17 points and tallied 12 boards in leading the Dolphins rally...junior **Maggie Wilson** added 11 points after going 3 of 5 beyond the arc, while sophomore **Abril Peeples** had 10 points, six boards and four steals.

## 70 = W

Scoring 70 is the magic number for the Dolphins this season.

The Dolphins are 5-1 when they have scored 70 or more points in contest. In three of the five wins, the Dolphins have scored 80 points, including a season-high 87 in the first victory against Jacksonville State.

JU is 2-15 when they have scored less than 70 points this season.

## Home sweet home

Home is where the heart is and that is the case for the Dolphins.

Six of JU's seven wins this season have been at home.

In the first two home games, the Dolphins averaged 57 points to their opponents 73.0 clip for a pair of losses. They were also out rebounded, 102-76, and saw their opponents go the the line 41 times for a 80.5 average.

It has been a different story in the last seven contests as the Dolphins hold a 72.3 to 65.0 scoring edge. JU has forced 149 turnovers in those games and picked up 88 steals.

Senior **Crystal Bell** is leading the Dolphins during this home stretch with 14.6 points a contest, 28 steals and

nine blocks. Sophomore **Jade Cargill** is averaging a double-double (13.7 ppg, 10.1 rpg) for the Dolphins.

## Ring my Bell

Senior **Crystal Bell** is scoring every which way possible for the Dolphins' offense.

Since Nov. 29, Bell has hit double-figures in 16 of 18 games, including 15 or more points five times.

The Fort Pierce, Fla., native had 19 points and seven steals in the overtime win against Lipscomb (1/2) to later set up her conference player of the week honor. She scored a season-best 20 points and tallied six steals in the double overtime loss at Stetson (1/7).

Against ETSU (1/14), Bell scored 18 points on four of five attempts from beyond the arc to go along with three assists and three steals. Bell finished with a 11 points, 10 boards and four steals in the win at Mercer (1/19).

Bell came off the bench at Belmont (1/28) and tallied 17 points and 12 rebounds. She scored eight of the 17 points in 10 seconds during the final two minutes as the Dolphins tried to rally back. Bell had 14 points, nine boards and four steals against Stetson (2/2).

Bell leads the team in scoring (12.9), steals (61), blocks (20), while ranking second in rebounds (7.2). She also needs just three steals to tie for fifth all-time. Bell is nine steals away from tying the JU single-season mark of 70 by **Virginia Gregoire (2007-08)**.

## Peeples for the people

One personal victory for the Dolphins this season is having sophomore **Abril Peeples** back on a regular basis.

The Americus, Ga., native has been limited to just 10 games in the last two seasons because of two knee injuries. Last season, she hit two three-pointers off the bench at Mercer (1/24), but suffered her second knee injury in that contest.

This season, she has started in 14 contests and is averaging 25.6 minutes a game. She leads the Dolphins in assists (53), while ranking third in scoring (9.7) and steals (40).

Peeples has done a lot of her damage off the bench, scoring double-digits in seven of 10 contests from Dec. 29 to Jan. 21. She added 17 points off the bench, including two key baskets to tie the game, in the South Carolina State (12/29) win.

Peeples filled up the stat line against Lipscomb (1/2

with 15 points, five assists, four steals and four boards in 28 minutes. She recorded 12 points and nine rebounds off the bench at FGCU (1/9) before hitting 3 of 4 three-pointers for 13 points against USC upstate (1/12). Peebles scored 19 points and has three steals off the bench against ETSU (1/14).

At Lipscomb (1/26), Peebles returned to the starting lineup and had a team-high 17 points on 6 of 13 field goal attempts. She also had two three-pointers and two steals. She had 10 points, six boards and four steals in the start at Belmont (1/28).

**Sneed stays steady**

One of the bright spots for the Dolphins has been the play of junior **Tracie Sneed**.

The local native has scored seven or more points in the in 18 of the last 22 games to rank second with a 10.0 average. Sneed is also third in rebounds (6.4).

Sneed has also had double-doubles against Bowling Green State (12/11), South Carolina State (12/29), Belmont (1/2) and USC Upstate (1/12).

Sneed posted a season-best 21 points to go along with six boards in 44 minutes at Stetson (1/7). She matched that points total and her best rebounding mark (14) in the win against USC Upstate (1/12).

Much of Sneed's success has to do with her work at the free-throw line with a .724 average (89-123). Sneed hit 10 free throws against USC Upstate which was the most since **Danielle Gray** nailed the same amount against Florida A&M on Dec. 30, 2006. Overall, she needs only 13 more free throws to crack the top five in a single-season.

Sneed is in her first season with the Dolphins since transferring from Santa Fe College where she helped the Saints to two conference titles. She was a four-year starter at Andrew Jackson High School.

**Thievery**

JU is back to its pressure defense that has been a staple of Jill Dunn's style.

This season, the Dolphins lead the A-Sun with 262 steals. JU has more than 10 steals in 16 contests.

The Dolphins have tailed 15 or more steals six times, including a season-best 17 against Lipscomb (1/2). They also had 16 in the opener against FIU (11/11) and at Kennesaw State (1/21).

Senior **Crystal Bell** is currently second in the league with 61 steals, while sophomore **Jade Cargill** is sixth with 48 steals.

In 2006-07, the Dolphins tallied a program-record with 309 team steals and set the single-game mark of 21 against UCF (11/17/07) the following season. JU broke the single-season total for the fifth year in a row during the 2008-09 season with 328 steals, while the Dolphins finished the 2009-10 year ranked third in the A-Sun with 288 steals (9.6 spg). The Dolphins recorded 10 or more steals in 12 contests last season.

In 2010-11, the Dolphins were fourth in the A-Sun with 279 steals, but they recorded 10 or more steals on 12 occasions. They had more than seven steals in 18 of the final 24 contests.

**Bell earns A-Sun Player of the Week**

Senior **Crystal Bell** was named A-Sun Player of the Week after helping JU to home wins against South Carolina State and Lipscomb.

Bell posted double-digits in points in both contests and recorded 11 steals in leading the Dolphins to two comeback wins. She is also the first Dolphin to earn the weekly honor since **Courtney Jackson** in 2008.

Bell scored 13 points against South Carolina State, including the game-winning point on a free throw for the 68-67 victory. She also posted six rebounds, four steals and three blocks to help the cause.

Against Lipscomb, Bell paced the Dolphins with a season-high 19 points and recorded eight rebounds. She had a career-best seven steals which tied **Rebecca Montz** (2/14/04) and **Angela Walker** (2/8/01) for the most in a single-game at JU.

**Beating them outside the arc**

**Jill Dunn** will not let her squads get beaten from beyond the arc and the Dolphins have shown that in the last few seasons.

Since Dunn took over the program in 2004-05, the Dolphins have finished in the top five of the A-Sun in 3-point field goal percentage defense on six occasions, including a league-leading .278 average in 2009-10.

This season, the Dolphins have allowed 99 makes in 340 attempts for a .291 average to rank third in the A-Sun.

JU has allowed two or less made three-pointers in seven contests.

The New Year brings a new Dolphins team to the court.

In four of the last six seasons, JU has improved its record once the calendar rolled over to January.

In 2007-08, the program's best season, JU started 10-3 and finished 13-6 en route to the Dolphins' first appearance in the A-Sun Championship game. The 2008-09 squad went 5-6 before closing out the year with a 14-7 mark, which led them back to the A-Sun finals.

This season, the Dolphins are 5-6 in 2012 after starting 2-10 to begin the year.

## Dolphins sign three players to NLI

JU is already looking ahead after signing guards **Queen Alford** (5-8, Decatur, Ga.) and **Briana Brown** (5-11, Haines City, Fla.) and forward **Elizabeth Landers** (6-1, Greenville, S.C.) for the 2012-13 season.

Alford and Brown will help fill the shoes of seniors **Jessica George** and **Crystal Bell**. Landers will add more depth to the posts. Landers will also be reunited with current freshman **Britney Holliday**, who were teammates at JL Mann High School.

## Not so...hot start

Last season, the Dolphins raced to a 5-1 start in the first six games, which was the best under head coach **Jill Dunn** and in program history.

This season is the opposite as they were winless in the first six games - the worst in the Dunn Era.

The three best starts under Dunn (2006-07, 2007-08 & 2010-11) each resulted in trips to the A-Sun Championship game.

## JU picked sixth & seventh in A-Sun polls

The JU women's basketball team was picked to finish sixth in the 2011-12 edition of Atlantic Sun Conference preseason coaches' poll.

Florida Gulf Coast, eligible for the A-Sun tournament for the first time this season, was selected first for the third straight year with 95 points and eight first-place votes. Defending tournament champion Stetson was second with 87 points. East Tennessee State (81), Belmont (64) and North Florida (61) rounded out the top five. JU, USC Upstate, Mercer, Kennesaw State and Lipscomb made up the rest of the poll.

In the media poll, FGCU was first again with 190 points and all 19 first-place tallies. ETSU was slotted second

with 159 points, while Stetson (149), UNF (114) and USC Upstate (118) rounded out the top five. Belmont, JU, Kennesaw State, Mercer and Lipscomb comprised the rest of the poll.

The Eagles were also picked to win the A-Sun Tournament in both polls.

## Stewart joins coaching staff

The Dolphins have a new face on the bench as **Alex Stewart** joins the coaching staff for the 2011-12 season.

Stewart comes to JU after spending the last three years at her alma mater, Georgia Tech, as an academic coach and assistant director of basketball operations. She replaces **DeUnna Hendrix**, who accepted a similar position at High Point University in June.

With the Yellow Jackets, she assisted student-athletes with their academic progress in 2010-11, while also helping with initial eligibility certification of prospective student-athletes.

Stewart returned to the Atlanta campus on the basketball operations staff in May 2008 and coordinated practice times, assisted with scouting and oversaw film exchange. She also served as the summer camp director of MaChelle Joseph's Basketball Camps.

Prior to Georgia Tech, she was the head basketball coach at Agnes Scott College during the 2007-08 season after serving as an assistant coach for the two previous years. She led the squad to a 17-9 record, the best mark in school history, for a second in the regular season.

## Two signs pro contracts

For the first time in the Jill Dunn era, the Dolphins had not one but two players sign professionally earlier this year.

**Taneskei Richardson** (2008-11) signed a professional contract in November to play for the HyPo Koris (Hyvinkaa Ponteva) in Finland, while **Desarae Johnson** (2006-10) got early Christmas present by signing a professional contract to play for the Loyola Basketball Club in Malta (southern Europe).

The duo is the first set of Dolphins to play professionally since **Kat Sungy** (1999-03) was a member of the Dublin-based Tolka Rovers in the Irish Basketball Association during the 2003-04 season.

Richardson finished her three-year career ranked fifth all-time in field percentage (.445) and rebounds (572).

Last season, she passed Sungy (283, 2001-02) for the most rebounds in a single-season with 315 and shattered the offensive record with 124 boards, while placing fifth in blocks.

Johnson finished the season third in scoring with 8.0 points a contest and had a team-best 7.1 rebounds. She had four double-doubles, highlighted by a 12-point and 13-rebound effort at Wake Forest. Johnson also had 22 steals.

# HEAD COACH JILL DUNN



Jill Dunn enters her eighth season as the head coach of the JU women's basketball program in 2011-12 and is poised for the program's first Atlantic Sun Conference Championship, which eluded them in the last four seasons.

In 2010-11, the Dolphins were once again at the doorstep of earning a NCAA Tournament berth after reaching the A-Sun Championship final for the third time in the last four seasons. The Dolphins opened the year with a school-record 5-1 mark en route to hitting double-digit wins for the sixth straight season (15). Some of JU's victories included wins against ACC foe Wake Forest, 2011 NCAA Tournament participant Hampton and ETSU in the A-Sun Tournament which ended the Lady Bucs bid at a fourth straight conference title. Along the way, Dunn also picked up her 100th win at JU with a 74-59 victory against Lipscomb on Feb. 5, 2011.

JU recorded the second highest point per game average (64.0) this season behind the program record of 67.7 in 2007-08, while also breaking the school mark in rebounds for the fifth straight season with 1,337 boards. The Dolphins finished third in the A-Sun in blocks with 125.

In seven years with the program, she has compiled 104 wins with the help of consecutive 20-win seasons during the 2006-07 and 2007-08 campaigns. The Dolphins just missed the feat again for a third straight year after picking up 19 wins in 2008-09.

Prior to JU, Dunn spent three years helping Georgia State to three consecutive A-Sun Conference titles from 2001-04. Before joining Georgia State, Dunn was the top assistant coach at Miami University (Ohio), during the 2000-01 season.

Prior to her one-year stint in Ohio, Dunn served as the head coach at Western Carolina University in Cullowhee, N.C., from 1998-00. In her final season with the program, the Lady Catamounts posted 12 wins which was the most in 15 seasons at WCU.

Before being elevated to the head spot at Western Carolina, she was the top assistant coach during the 1997-98 campaign. Dunn's coaching career began at the University of South Carolina, where she was as an assistant coach from 1994-97.

Dunn's success began as a player at Georgia Southern, where she was a three-year starter from 1989-93. She was named to the Georgia Southern Hall of Fame on Nov. 4, 2007.

MIAMI – A slow start by JU in the season opener would lead to a 63-37 loss at Florida International.

Jerica Corley had a near triple-double with 22 points, 11 rebounds and eight assists to lead three Golden Panthers in double figures. Finda Mansare recorded 16 points of 7 of 12 attempts, while Kamika Idom rounded out the group with 12 points.

The Dolphins, who fell behind by 10 points in the first six minutes, shot 14 for 70 from the floor and went to the free throw line only 14 times. JU did outscore FIU in the second half (28-26), while finishing with 20 points off of turnovers.

Senior Crystal Bell managed to stay above the fray for JU by finishing with 16 points, 11 boards and five steals.

In the first half, FIU opened with an 8-0 lead on a layup from Idom at 16:28. Bell added the first points of the season less than a minute later, but the Golden Panthers extended the lead to 17-4 on a Corley layup (12:43). The Dolphins couldn't get out of their funk as FIU closed the half on a 20-5 stretch to take a 37-9 advantage into the locker room.

Zsafia Lapidky picked up 10 boards for the Golden Panthers, while Carmen Miloglav chipped in with six points.

Late in the second half, the Dolphins managed a small 6-0 run, capped on a layup from Bell at 8:59. Sophomore Madison Scott and freshman Chelsea Faulhaber each tallied points with less than seven minutes left, while sophomore Jane'l Osborne hit her fourth straight free throw in the final seconds.

Osborne along with fellow sophomore Jade Cargill and Abril Peeples each finished with five points for JU.

JACKSONVILLE, FLA. – Three players in double figures wasn't enough for JU as they suffered a 78-59 loss to Florida A&M in the home opener at Swisher Gymnasium.

Antonia Bennett had 27 points, 14 rebounds and four blocks to lead the Lady Rattlers (to their first win, while Qiana Donald chipped in with 13 points and 13 rebounds. Florida A&M made its living in the paint, scoring 48 points and pulling down 57 rebounds.

Sophomore Abril Peeples totaled a career-best 22 points and four assists for the Dolphins, who dropped their first home opener in nine seasons. JU's last lost in an opener was to Navy in 2001.

The Dolphins recorded a 34.2 field goal percentage (26-76), but only made three free throws in nine attempts. The Lady Rattlers went 42.9 percent from the floor and were held to 1 for 15 from beyond the arc.

Less than two minutes in the second half, junior Tracie Sneed broke the sixth tie of the contest with a three-pointer to give the Dolphins a 39-36 advantage. The Lady Rattlers broke free with a 17-4 run, capped on a Kimberly Sparkman three-pointer (13:21). Senior Crystal Bell cut the deficit six, 53-47, on a coast-to-coast layup with 10:04 left. The Dolphins made it a 59-51 deficit on a sophomore Jane'l Osborne layup (8:47), but Florida A&M ended the game on an 18-9 stretch to secure the win.

Sneed finished with 12 points on 5 of 11 attempts and two perfect attempts from beyond the arc. Bell added 10 points, nine rebounds and three assists in the loss.

In the first half, Bell gave the Dolphins a 21-17 advantage on a jumper at 8:47. Osborne pushed the lead to five twice on a free throw and layup. The Lady Rattlers regained the lead, 27-26, at 4:16 on a Carrington Caise layup. Peeples hit consecutive layups to help JU take back the lead before two Sparkman free throws cut the Florida A&M deficit to 33-32 at half time.

The Lady Pirates scored 14 of the first 18 points in the second half en route to the victory. Jericka Jenkins scored 15 points to pace Hampton. Arel Phillips (12 points, 11 rebounds) and Alyssa Bennett (11 points, 11 rebounds) each finished with double-doubles, while Keiara Avant had 10 points.

RALEIGH, N.C. – North Carolina State took advantage of a slow start by JU for an 80-42 victory in Reynolds Coliseum.

Krystal Barrett tallied 14 points to lead five Wolfpack players in double-figures. Erica Donovan had 13 points, while Boane Holston finished with 12 points in helping the cause.

The Dolphins shot 23.5 percent (8-34) from the floor in the first half to match their worst start since the 2001-02 season. The Wolfpack finished with 39.0 field goal percentage, while holding the advantage in rebounds (64-40), points in the paint (42) and blocks (11).

In the first half, the Dolphins took a 5-4 lead on a three-pointer from sophomore Abril Peeples (18:59). Kody Burke scored five of NC State's next eight points for a 12-5 advantage. Peeples continued to be the Dolphins only offense with two more buckets to cut the deficit to 17-9 at 12:35.
