2011-12 PRESEASON NOTES

JU picked sixth & seventh in A-Sun polls

The JU women's basketball team was picked to finish sixth in the 2011-12 edition of Atlantic Sun Conference preseason coaches' poll.

Florida Gulf Coast, eligible for the A-Sun tournament for the first time this season, was selected first for the third straight year with 95 points and eight first-place votes. Defending tournament champion Stetson was second with 87 points. East Tennessee State (81), Belmont (64) and North Florida (61) rounded out the top five. JU, USC Upstate, Mercer, Kennesaw State and Lipscomb made up the rest of the poll.

In the media poll, FGCU was first again with 190 points and all 19 first-place tallies. ETSU was slotted second with 159 points, while Stetson (149), UNF (114) and USC Upstate (118) rounded out the top five. Belmont, JU, Kennesaw State, Mercer and Lipscomb comprised the rest of the poll.

The Eagles were also picked to win the A-Sun Tournament in both polls and Stetson's Victoria McGowan was selected as the preseason Player of the Year to highlight the all-conference selections.

Stewart joins coaching staff

The Dolphins will have a new face on the bench as **Alex Stewart** joins the coaching staff for the 2011-12 season.

Stewart comes to JU after spending the last three years at her alma mater, Georgia Tech, as an academic coach and assistant director of basketball operations. She replaces **DeUnna Hendrix**, who accepted a similar position at High Point University in June.

With the Yellow Jackets, she assisted student-athletes with their academic progress in 2010-11, while also helping with initial eligibility certification of prospective student-athletes.

Stewart returned to the Atlanta campus on the basketball operations staff in May 2008 and coordinated practice times, assisted with scouting and oversaw film exchange. She also served as the summer camp director of MaChelle Joseph's Basketball Camps.

Prior to Georgia Tech, she was the head basketball coach at Agnes Scott College during the 2007-08 season after serving as an assistant coach for the two previous years. She led the squad to a 17-9 record, the best mark in school history, for a second place finish in the regular season.

Richardson signs pro contract

Former JU standout **Taneskei Richardson** will not have to put away her hoops sneakers quite yet as she signed a professional contract to play for the HyPo Koris (Hyvinkaa Pöytä) in Finland.

Richardson becomes the second Dolphin to play professionally overseas, joining **Kat Sungy** (1999-03) who was a member of the Dublin-based Tolka Rovers in the Irish Basketball Association during the 2003-04 season.

The former Robert E. Lee High School product finished her three-year career ranked fifth all-time in field percentage (.445) and rebounds (572). Last season, she passed Kat Sungy (283, 2001-02) for the most rebounds in a single-season with 315 and shattered the offensive record with 124 boards, while placing fifth in blocks.

As a senior, Richardson led the Dolphins in scoring (11.1), field goal percentage (.460), rebounds (9.8) and blocks (4.3). She was also second in steals (4.8) and ranked third in assists (4.2). Richardson tallied 14 double-doubles, including hitting the feat 10 times in the final 17 contests en route to A-Sun all-tournament honors. Nationally, she finished the year ranked 27th in double-doubles and 32nd in rebounds.

This Bell tolls for JU

Junior guard **Crystal Bell** became the scoring threat the coaching staff hoped for when she transferred from Brevard Community College.

Bell was fourth in scoring (9.3 ppg), while ranking second in field goal percentage with a .414 average.

She made a statement in her first game as a Dolphin by scoring a team-high 22 points at USF (12/17), which was the highest debut by any JU player.

In Nashville, Bell matched her season-high once again at Lipscomb (1/8) by scoring 23 points off the bench after going 8-of-16 from the floor and hitting six free throws. She posted 10 points off the bench, while also adding a season-high three assists in the win against Belmont (1/10).

Bell tallied 13 points and three assists in just 17 minutes against USC Upstate on Jan. 17. She came off the bench against Lipscomb (2/5) and added 11 points in 16 minutes before topping it with 12 points vs. UNF (2/8) off the bench. Bell hit double-figures off the bench for the third straight game at USC Upstate (2/12/11) with 10 points.

She closed the regular season with 15 points, eight re-

bounds and five assists off the bench in the loss at Stetson (2/26)

Much of her success had to do with Bell's team-best 55 steals, which ranked fifth on the single-season list. She had three or more steals on 10 occasions, including a season-best four steals against Hampton (11/27), Stetson (2/26) and ETSU (3/4).

Hot start

The Dolphins raced out to a 5-1 start in the first six games, which is the best under head coach **Jill Dunn** and in program history.

The start for JU edged out the 4-2 records in the first six games of the 2006-07 and 2007-08 campaigns. Both seasons ended with the Dolphins earning a trip to the A-Sun Championship game.

Block Party

The Dolphins were once again near the top of the conference in blocks for the second straight season.

In 2010-11, the Dolphins finished third in the conference with 125 blocks. JU tallied four or more blocks on 18 occasions this season.

They had seven rejections against FGCU (12/4) and Wake Forest (12/17) before breaking that high with nine blocks vs. Long Island (12/30). JU also swatted eight shots against Stetson in the A-Sun Championship

Senior forward **Taneskei Richardson** led the team with 43 blocks, while fellow seniors **Lynsey Paschal** (19) and **GiGiThomas** (17) ranked second and third, respectively.

Jill Dunn enters her eighth season as the head coach of the JU women's basketball program in 2011-12 and is poised for the program's first A-Sun Championship, which eluded them in the last four seasons.

In seven seasons, Dunn has transformed the program into an A-Sun powerhouse as the Dolphins earned votes in the 2007-08 USA Today/ESPN Coaches Top-25 Poll and three trips to the conference championship game (2007-08, 2008-09 & 2010-11). She has also led the Dolphins to back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time in program history (2006-07, 2007-08), while missing the feat for the third consecutive time in 2008-09 by one game (19).

In 2010-11, the Dolphins were once again at the doorstep of earning a NCAA Tournament berth after reaching the A-Sun Championship game for the third time in the last four seasons. The Dolphins opened the year with a school-record 5-1 mark en route to hitting double-digit wins for the sixth straight season (15). Some of JU's victories included wins against ACC foe Wake Forest, 2011 NCAA Tournament participant Hampton and ETSU in the A-Sun Tournament which ended the Lady Bucs bid at a fourth straight conference title. Along the way, Dunn also picked up her 100th win at JU with a 74-59 victory against Lipscomb on Feb. 5, 2011.

JU recorded the second highest point per game average (64.0) in 2010-11 behind the program record of 67.7 in 2007-08, while also breaking the school mark in rebounds for the fifth straight season with 1,337 boards. The Dolphins finished third in the A-Sun in blocks with 125.

Senior forward Taneskei Richardson put the Dolphins on her shoulders all season after leading the team in scoring (11.1), field goal percentage (.460), rebounds (9.8) and blocks (43). Richardson would break the single-season rebounds record with a total of 315, while placing fifth on the blocks list.

Senior forward Lynsey Paschal rounded out her career by finishing with the most games played all-time (124) and placing sixth in career rebounds (558). She also had 232 rebounds in 2010-11 to place fifth on the single-season list, while junior guard Crystal Bell tied for fifth in steals with 55.

In 2009-10, the Dolphins hit double-digit wins for the fifth straight season, while also reaching the Atlantic Sun Tournament for the fifth consecutive time under Dunn. JU also reached the conference semifinals for the fourth year in a row after the Dolphins downed Campbell in the first round.

The Dolphins finished first in the A-Sun in blocks (140) and third in steals (288), while also setting a new school record in rebounds with 1,289 boards. JU continued its stingy defense by limiting five opponents to under 50 points. In six total seasons, the Dolphins have held 23 opponents to under 50 points, which only occurred five times in five total seasons before Dunn took over the program.

Freshman guard Drameka Griggs finished second in scoring with 8.2 points per game, while leading the squad in assists (59) and steals (50) en route to the Dolphins' first Atlantic Sun Conference all-freshman selection since the 2000-01 season.

Senior forwards Desarae Johnson and Crystal Grable each produced quality seasons to have their names etched in the JU record books. Johnson produced 35 blocks to finish second all-time in blocks with 127. She also took fifth in the career books

in rebounds (524) and fielding percentage (.414). Grable had a block in nine of her final 10 games to take the third spot all-time with 94 rejections.

In 2008-09, Dunn led the Dolphins to a 19-13 overall record, a 13-7 mark in conference play and the No. 2 seed for the third straight year en route to securing a spot in the A-Sun championship game for the second straight season.

The Jill Dunn pressure defense came up big as the Dolphins produced a strong defensive presence and held a program-record seven opponents to under 50 points.

The Dolphins were led by the senior guard trio of Virginia Gregoire, Regina Omoite and DaVina Hamilton, who each finished their careers in the top five of several career categories.

Gregoire finished second all-time in points with 1,345 and steals with 198. She also wrapped her career ranking third in rebounds (602), assists (332), 3-pointers made (137) and minutes played (3,259).

Omoite set career records in assists (459) and minutes played (3,953), while finishing fifth in scoring with 1,027 points. She also placed second in three-pointers made (172), third in steals (191) and fifth in free throws made (193).

Hamilton etched her name at the top of the JU career list in steals with 220 and ranks second all-time in assists with 361. She was just 73 points shy of becoming the sixth player to reach the 1,000-point plateau as she finished sixth in scoring (927).

After remodeling the history of the program in 2006-07, the Dolphins took it to a new level in 2007-08 by recording their best finish in program history (23-9) while reaching the Atlantic Sun Conference Championship Game for the very first time. JU also tallied 11 conference wins and solidified the No. 2 seed in the A-Sun tournament for the second consecutive season.

Along with the program's best finish, the squad also rewrote the JU record book with 13 new team records, including back-to-back 20-win seasons, consecutive wins (10), consecutive home wins (17) and road wins (9).

In only her fourth year with the program, Dunn established JU at the national level by ranking second in the nation in consecutive home wins, earning votes in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches Top 25 Poll and tallying wins from opponents in the SEC (Florida), ACC (Miami) and Atlantic 10 (UMass).

In the midst of all the accomplishments, Dunn earned her 50th career win at JU as the Dolphins defeated Kennesaw State, 61-53, on Jan. 14, 2008 in Kennesaw, Ga.

In the single-season record book, the Dolphins established new records for points per game (67.7), points (2,167), field-goals made (814), blocks (126), assists (472) and rebounds (1,210) while averaging a program-low 16.7 turnovers per contest. Senior forward Ashley Williams, who ended her career as arguably the best player in history, notched program records for points (1,489), field goals made (579) and blocks (128) and junior guard Virginia Gregoire became the fifth Dolphin to reach 1,000 career points. Along with Gregoire's program record for steals (161), junior guard Regina Omoite set a new program record with 305 assists.

In her third season, JU set the first standard for program wins in a season (21) and finished with a then best record in history (21-9) to surpass the previous mark of 13-15 by the 2000-01 squad. The Dolphins surpassed their previous A-Sun record (9-

9, 2000-01) and finished the year with a 14-4 mark and earned the program's highest seed (second) in the conference tournament.

The records didn't stop there as the squad set a new record for consecutive home wins (surpassing the previous mark of six in 2000-01) and finished the year with 10-consecutive wins at home before heading into postseason play. The Dolphins finished the year with a nine-game winning streak, won 16 of their last 19 games and 15 of their last 18 A-Sun games. The Dolphins also went 6-1 in January, 6-1 in February and 2-1 in March for a combined record of 14-3 in 2007.

The Dolphins also set new standards on the road with a record of 7-7, surpassing the previous mark of 4-10 by the 2000-01 squad, while also tallying a program-record four-game road winning streak.

As a team, JU set new marks for overall points scored (1,986), overall points averaged (66.2 ppg), steals (309) in a season and steals in a game (17). The squad's points-per-game average was the first more than 60 and the points total was the first more than 1,700 in program history.

Individually, junior forward Ashley Williams and sophomore guard Virginia Gregoire were each named first team all-conference after ranking second (17 ppg) and third (14.6 ppg), respectively, among conference scoring leaders. The duo became the first set of Dolphin teammates to earn first team honors in school history.

During the season, Dunn set a new program record for wins by a Dolphin head coach (36) with a 64-57 win over Mercer on Jan. 27.

In 2005-06, Dunn engineered the Dolphin offense into the most potent scoring machine in program history. The up-tempo style of play and pressure defense paved the way for a then program-record 62.6 points per contest as the Dolphins played with an undersized, youthful squad due to injuries to the front line.

Williams became the second Dolphin to earn first team all-conference accolades after setting a program record with 478 points. She also became the third member of the program to earn preseason all-conference honors after leading the A-Sun in field-goal percentage (.562) and ranking second in blocked shots (1.9 bpg).

Guard Sheena Carpenter earned second team all-conference accolades and became the third Dolphin to surpass the 1,000 career-point plateau.

In her first season with the program, Dunn led the Dolphins to their most overall and conference wins in two seasons, despite injuries decimating her frontcourt early in the year. JU also set new program marks after finishing second in the conference with an average of 17.1 turnovers and a turnover margin of 1.89 per contest.

Also under her tutelage, Carpenter developed into one of the top players in the A-Sun and earned preseason all-conference honors. She finished the 2004-05 season with career highs in every offensive category.

Along with player development on the court, Dunn also rubbed her coaching prowess onto others as former Dolphins Rebecca Montz (Centenary College) and Yolisha Jackson (Kennesaw State) were hired as assistant coaches.

In three seasons at Georgia State, Dunn served as the recruiting coordinator and top assistant coach as the Panthers captured three straight A-Sun regular-season titles and played in the 2002 and 2003 NCAA Tournaments. The Panthers also tallied 59 wins in her three seasons, including a 40-16 mark in A-Sun play. In 2003-04, Dunn's recruiting class was rated in the Top 100 nationally by All-Star Girls Report.

Before joining Georgia State, Dunn was the top assistant coach at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio. The RedHawks finished 18-11 overall in 2000-01 with Dunn serving as the primary recruiting coordinator, while also working with the RedHawk post players.

Prior to her one-year stint in Miami, Dunn served as the head coach at Western Carolina University in Cullowhee, N.C., from 1998-00. In her final season with the program, the Lady Catamounts posted 12 wins which was the most in 15 seasons at WCU and the most ever by a first-year head coach in the Southern Conference. Prior to being elevated to the head spot at Western Carolina, Dunn was the top assistant coach during the 1997-98 campaign.

Dunn's coaching career began at the University of South Carolina where she was as an assistant coach from 1994-97. In three seasons, she coached current WNBA star Shannon Johnson of the 2004 champion Connecticut Sun and Annie Lester, who is currently playing in Europe. Johnson was also a member of the gold-medal winning U.S. Olympic team in the summer of 2004.

Dunn's success began as a player at Georgia Southern, where she was a three-year starter from 1989-93. While serving as team captain as a senior, Dunn earned second team A-II-Southern Conference honors and was selected to the Southern Conference all-tournament team after averaging 9.3 points, 3.4 assists and 2.1 steals. In 1993, she led the Lady Eagles to the SoCon Tournament championship game and a berth in the NCAA Tournament.

Currently the Eagles' record-holder for career three-point field goal percentage (37.3%, 120-322), Dunn ranks fifth on the season (47) and sixth on the career GSU three-pointers made list. She also finished with the Lady Eagles' fourth, seventh and 10th-best season three-point percentages (38.6 - 1991; 37.0 - 1992; 35.6 - 1993) and stands fourth all-time in assists (318) and eighth in career steals (164). As a senior, she was also named GSU's Woman of the Year and Scholar Athlete of the Year. Dunn earned her bachelor's degree in education from Georgia Southern in 1994.

For her efforts, Dunn was named to the Georgia Southern Hall of Fame on Sept. 25, 2006. A member of a six-person class, she was later inducted by the school in a ceremony at the Gene Bishop Field House on Nov. 3, 2006 and was later recognized during halftime activities of the Georgia Southern-Wofford football game at Paulson Stadium the next day.

In her prep career, Dunn was a basketball and track star at Northwest Whitfield High School in Tunnell Hill, Ga. As a senior, she led the Bruins to a 29-1 record before losing in the state playoffs. For her efforts, she earned all-state and region player-of-the-year honors and was invited to play in Georgia/Tennessee All-Star Game and the Georgia All-Star Game. After being selected region player of the year as a junior and senior, she was invited to participate with the SCORE International traveling team, which competed in Costa Rica. Dunn also became just the second female in Northwest Whitfield High School history to have her jersey retired.

A member of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association, Dunn currently serves as a coach and speaker at regional camps and clinics. She is currently on the State Farm All-America committee and has served as the A-Sun conference captain for the WBCA from 2007-10.

Born Nov. 21, 1971 in Birmingham, Ala., Dunn grew up in Dalton, Ga. and lives in Jacksonville.

Associate Head Coach
Seventh Season

Dee Pennix begins her seventh season at JU and her fourth year as associate head coach.

Along with serving as the program's recruiting coordinator, she is in charge of the Dolphin guards after spending her first three seasons working with the post players.

Last season, GiGi Thomas, Ashanti Williams and Crystal Bell each were key players at the guard position.

Thomas finished second on the team in scoring (10.3 ppg), three-pointers (27) and assists (48), while taking third in steals (35) and blocks (17). She also recorded double-doubles vs. Wake Forest (12 pts., 10 rebs., 12/17) and Mercer (14 pts., 11 rebs., 1/24).

Williams had double-figures in scoring off the bench on seven occasions, including hitting the 20-point barrier three times. Bell finished tied for fifth on the single-season list in steals (55), while also scoring 21 points in the opener at USF – the most by a Dolphin in their debut at JU.

In 2009-10, the Dolphins finished third in the A-Sun in steals (288), including 10 or more steals in 12 contests.

Pennix was also instrumental in helping Thomas and Williams to solid seasons in the Dolphins backcourt. Thomas scored in double figures in her final four games, including a season-high 23 points and two blocks in the A-Sun Tournament win over Campbell. Williams finished second in three-point percentage (.268) and assists (56). She also recorded double-digits in scoring in four straight games (1/14-23) which included a career-best 17 points in the overtime win against UNF (1/18).

In 2008-09, she helped senior guards Regina Omoite, DaVina Hamilton and Virginia Gregiore cap their careers as the best front-court players in school history.

Hamilton posted a team-high 10.0 points per game and 63 steals – which is third on the single-season list. She also ranked second with 95 assists, while Gregiore was second in points per game (9.5). Omoite broke her own single-season record with a team-high 154 assists and finished second on the squad with 56 steals.

In the career record books, Gregiore finished second in scoring with 1,345 points, while Omoite took fifth with 1,027 points. The trio also ended their careers ranked in the top three spots in steals and assists, as well as, the top five in minutes played.

From 2005-08, Pennix helped develop forward Ashley Williams into one of the most dominant forces in the A-Sun and arguably the best player in program history.

As a senior, Williams notched program records for points (1,489), field goals made (579) and blocks

(128) while earning first team all-conference honors, A-Sun All-Tournament team and preseason Player of the Year accolades. As a junior, Williams surpassed her own program record with 509 points as she earned first team all-conference honors for the second consecutive season. As a sophomore, Williams set a previous program record with 478 points and became only the second Dolphin to earn first team all-conference honors.

Pennix also worked with a group of underclassmen post players (Crystal Grable, Danielle Gray, Desarae Johnson and Lynsey Paschal) who have combined to help the Dolphins achieve the No. 1 spot in the 2007-08 Preseason Coaches Poll, votes in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches Top-25 Poll, back-to-back 20-win seasons and the sixth best turnaround in the nation in two seasons.

Among the single-season records accomplished by the Dolphins in 2008-09 were blocks (126) and rebounds (1,210). Grable enjoyed the most improved season by tallying career bests in every category, including ranking second on the squad with a career-high 24 blocked shots.

Prior to JU, she served two years as an assistant at Coastal Carolina, where she assisted in all aspects of the program and also served as the recruiting coordinator.

In two years with the Chanticleers, Pennix helped lead the squad to a pair of Big South Conference Tournament appearances and was responsible for restructuring the 2004-05 team after graduating their entire starting lineup the previous year. Her top recruit, Kim Turner, was named second team All-Big South after leading the Lady Chants with 13.1 points, 6.0 rebounds and 1.2 blocks per contest this past year.

Pennix joined the Coastal Carolina staff in 2003 after spending four years as an assistant coach at her alma-mater, High Point University, where she served as travel coordinator, developed and monitored strength and conditioning programs and assisted in recruiting.

During her tenure at High Point, she helped the Panthers improve their record from 6-22 in 1999-00 to an 18-12 mark the following year and advance to the Big South Conference Championship Game against Liberty. She has also served as a collegiate camp clinician at Wake Forest, Appalachian State, High Point and Coastal Carolina during her career.

A four-year letterwinner at High Point from 1995-99, Pennix led the Panthers to a pair of Carolina-Virginia Athletic Conference Tournament titles and an appearance in the NCAA Division II East Regional Elite Eight in 1996. She earned Carolina-Virginia Athletic Conference Rookie-of-the-Year accolades in 1995 and was also named CVAC All-Tournament in 1995 and 1996.

As a senior, Pennix served as team captain and was later named the Panther's Most Valuable Player. She finished her career ranked seventh in the Panther record book with career 1,457 points.

In the summer of 2008, Pennix revived her playing

career by joining the Jacksonville Cougars of the Women's Blue Chip Basketball League (WBCBL) for a season.

A native of Elon, N.C., Pennix earned her bachelor's degree in physical education and recreation in 1999.



Ginny BOGGESS
Assistant Coach
Fourth Season

Ginny Boggess begins her fourth season with the JU coaching staff and is in charge of the Dolphins' post players.

In 2010-11, the Dolphins broke the school mark in rebounds for the fifth straight season with 1,337 boards and finished third in the A-Sun in blocks with 125.

Senior forward Taneskei Richardson flourished in her third and final year with the Dolphins by leading the team in scoring (11.1), field goal percentage (.460), rebounds (9.8) and blocks (43). She also broke the single-season rebounds record with a total of 315, while placing fifth on the blocks list.

Richardson had 14 double-doubles during the year, recording the feat 10 times in the final 17 contests. She tallied her best double-double at FGCU (2/24) after posting a career-high 21 points and 18 rebounds. The overall boards total ranked as the second highest single-game total of all-time, while her 13 offensive boards during the contest was a new single-game record.

In the career standings, Richardson finished with 15 double-doubles to rank third all-time, while placing fifth in field goal percentage (.445) and rebounds (572).

Senior Lynsey Paschal rounded out her career by finishing with the most games played all-time (124) and placing sixth in career rebounds (558). She also had 232 rebounds in 2010-11 to place fifth on the single-season list.

In 2009-10, the Dolphins finished first in the A-Sun with 140 blocks after recording four or more blocks in 19 contests, including 12 of the last 15 games. The Dolphins also set a new school record in rebounds with 1,289 boards.

Boggess helped senior forwards Desarae Johnson and Crystal Grable each produce quality seasons to have their names etched in the JU record books. Johnson recorded 35 blocks to finish second all-time with 127. She also took fifth in the career books in rebounds (524) and fielding percentage (.414). Grable had a block in nine of her final 10 games to take the third spot all-time with 94 rejections.

Paschal and Richardson also produced strong numbers under Boggess' tutelage. Paschal hit double figures in scoring on five occasions and recorded two double-double efforts. She also had 17 rebounds against Florida Tech, which is the third highest single-game total in the program records. Richardson



recorded five or more boards in nine of 10 games (1/7-2/11) to finished third on the team in rebounds (141). She also had a season-high 10 rebounds and 11 points against FGCU (1/9) for her first career double-double as a Dolphin.

Boggess was instrumental in helping Johnson and Grable during the 2008-09 season. Johnson had a career-best 134 rebounds and 53 blocks to pace the Dolphins. Her blocks total also ranked third on the single-season list, while Grable had the fifth highest single-season total in blocks with 41.

Prior to making her way to the First Coast, Boggess spent the past two seasons at Hofstra where she assisted in all aspects of the program, including working with the Pride guards and serving as the recruiting coordinator.

With the Pride, Boggess helped lead the squad to the Colonia Athletic Association tournament each season, including a school-best 26-8 overall record and a spot in the WNIT Quarterfinals in 2006-07. Under her guidance, senior guard Cigi McCollin (second team) and freshman guard Sam Brigham (rookie team) earned conference honors that season.

Boggess joined the Hofstra staff after spending two years as an assistant coach and one year as a graduate assistant at Kennesaw State. During her time with the Owls, she worked with perimeter players, while organizing practice planning, scouting, film breakdown, equipment, budgeting and booster club fundraising. She also assisted in all areas of recruiting and served as individual summer camp director and as assistant director of KSU's team camp.

Boggess also served as the shooting instructor and the assistant camp director of the Sports City U Basketball Academy in Teals Valley, W.Va. from 1999 through 2005 where she worked with former NBA shooting instructor Jim Clayton. In 2003, Boggess spent time as head coach of the AAU 15-under Piedmont Pride in Piedmont, N.C.

As a student-athlete, Boggess was a four-year starter at Wingate where she averaged 10 points, five rebounds and slightly five assists per game in her career. She was named to the South Atlantic Conference all-rookie team as a freshman and helped lead Wingate to the NCAA Division II Tournament as a sophomore in 2001. Boggess received the Wingate coaches award after her senior season.

A success in the classroom as well as the court, Boggess was named to the conference honor roll in each of her four seasons before receiving her bachelor's degree in communications with an emphasis in broadcast journalism in 2003.

Boggess was a columnist for the student newspaper, a feature reporter for WUTV and the host of the Bulldog Sports Television Show while at Wingate. In addition, she was a founding member of the Iota Zeta chapter of Alpha Xi Delta, recognized as a member of Who's Who Among American Colleges and Universities for her academic achievements and was Wingate's homecoming queen in 2003.

Active in the community, Boggess has been a volunteer with Habitat for Humanity, Bulldog Helping

Hands and Choose Children.

First Season

Alex Stewart will enter her first season in 2011-12 as an assistant coach on the Dolphins staff.

Stewart joins the JU staff after spending the last three years at her alma mater, Georgia Tech, as an academic coach and assistant director of basketball operations.

With the Yellow Jackets, she assisted student-athletes with their academic progress in 2010-11, while also helping with initial eligibility certification of prospective student-athletes.

Stewart returned to the Atlanta campus on the basketball operations staff in May 2008 and coordinated practice times, assisted with scouting and oversaw film exchange. She also served as the summer camp director of MaChelle Joseph's Basketball Camps.

Prior to Georgia Tech, she was the head basketball coach at Agnes Scott College during the 2007-08 season after serving as an assistant coach for the two previous years. She led the squad to a 17-9 record, the best mark in school history, for a second place finish in the regular season.

The Scotties posted a 33-22 record during Stewart's tenure as an assistant, including the program's first appearance in the Great South Athletic Conference Championship Game in 2006.

As a student-athlete, Stewart played on the Georgia Tech women's basketball team from 1999-04, earning Atlantic Coast all-conference honors as a junior and senior. In the career book, she ranks third all-time in assists (505) and fourth in free throw percentage (.777, 269-346).

Stewart became just the second tech player in school history to earn a triple double (11 pts., 10 rbs. & 11 asts.) on Jan. 30, 2001 against Charleston Southern. She was also the first player in ACC history to accomplish the feat coming off of the bench.

Following her collegiate career, she traveled to Ke flavik, Iceland to play professionally. She helped her team win the Icelandic Championship and was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player.

A native of Norcross, Ga., Stewart earned her bachelor's degree in international affairs in 2004.

BUILDING...

- Atlantic Sun student-athletes set a new all-time record with 63.79 percent earning All-Academic honors by achieving at least a 3.0 GPA during their season of competition last year.
- The A-Sun led all of Division I last year as the NCAA's top academic women's soccer conference; nine of 11 teams received national honors from the NSCAA for posting a team GPA of 3.0 or better, the highest percentage in the country.
- ETSU baseball standout Paul Hohlman won his second-straight A-Sun Student-Athlete of the Year award becoming just the fourth person in A-Sun history to accomplish that feat. The 2010 National College Home Run Derby Champion posted a 3.95 GPA in math and was named a Lowe's CLASS National finalist.

- Kennesaw State's Ben Greene earned the NCAA Elite-88 honor for having the best GPA among participants in the NCAA men's golf national championship.

- The A-Sun set multiple records for postseason participation in men's basketball and finished ranked 17th in conference RPI, leading all but the ACC, SEC and Conference USA among nine southeastern Division I conferences. A conference record three teams reached postseason play; the A-Sun earned three postseason wins, and hosted three postseason games with ETSU reaching the semifinals of the CIT and Jacksonville notching a postseason win for the second-straight year (2010 NIT, 2011 CIT).

- The A-Sun SAAC surpassed the \$100,000 mark for charitable fund raising, reaching \$103,000 in the seven-year history of the charitable challenge.
- The A-Sun claimed the Southeast D-I Athletic Director of the Year honor for the third-straight year, as Stetson's Jeff Altier followed ET-SU's Dave Mullins and Belmont's Mike Strickland in earning that distinction.
- Lipscomb basketball player Jenna Bartsokas earned post-graduate scholarships from both the A-Sun and the NCAA as she claimed the A-Sun Student-Athlete of the Year honor and was named a finalist for the NCAA Woman of the Year award.
- Three A-Sun institutions earned Top-10 rankings in U.S. News & World Report's annual rankings of the best regional universities in the southeast. Stetson at No. 3, Belmont at No. 5, and Mercer at No. 8 each earned top marks.
- The Princeton Review recognized ETSU, Mercer, North Florida and Belmont in its list of the Best Colleges in the southeast.
